Enhanced Residential Program (60% of median income):

- FREE high efficiency lighting
- FREE refrigerator replacement (if existing model is inefficient)
- FREE insulation, air sealing and other weatherization (up to \$3,000 in value)
- FREE heating system upgrade (if existing system is determined to be highly inefficient). Upgrade determined and implemented in conjunction with the Department of Housing and Community Development and National Grid Gas Programs

Residential Program (80% of median income):

- FREE high efficiency lighting
- FREE air sealing
- 100% incentive up to \$2,000 for recommended insulation and other weatherization measures
- \$150 rebate toward refrigerator replacement (if existing model is inefficient)

Residents with incomes above the 2010 income guidelines:
