 - An inventory list by route/pole no., address, lumens and type is available to DCAM Certified providers in Excel files upon request.
 - The final list of Facilities to be included in the EMS and O&M Contracts will be stipulated in the Technical Street Light IGA Report and may be reviewed and approved by MA DOER.

General Information Options and Alternatives

- The Compact and Participating Municipalities may consider additional improvements, including but not limited to:
 - Adaptive controls
 - Remote monitoring capability



Demo Project Review, cont'd

Selected Customer Feedback

- "...all of us appreciate energy conservation and with the LED lights fewer watts, power, are needed to get the work done. Still, I must ask you the question that, with the LED lights, why can't their luminance be reduced?" (Brewster)
- "...staring at "my" streetlight, still bright at 7:00 AM it seems to me that every one of these light, old and new, creates an excessively large pool of light. The fixtures, old and new, are a major part of the problem. Why should any of these lights shine on land adjacent to the road? Their "pool" should be a narrow oval, not a circle..." (Cotuit)
- "...the lights are too harsh. We need softer lights please..." (Provincetown)
- "...change them all please..." (Dennis)
- "...Great energy saver and white light..." (Sandwich)
- "...I think they look great, though I do imagine some folks may take some time to get used to the difference in color, simply because yellow streetlights is what we're all used to!" (Truro)
- "The light at the corner of Route 137 and Route 6A looks very dim compared to the others in the area." (Brewster)

Minimum Technical Specifications

- Refer to Appendix 6.6 for full specifications
 - 10-year warranty for all electronic components, including photocell and drivers (power supplies) and finish/coating.
 - Product samples may be requested before bulk purchase.
 - Must be Design Lights Consortium listed-products.
 - Except where noted by Special Terms & Conditions:
 - CCT shall be 4,300 + /-300 degrees Kelvin
 - · Lumens shall be equal or lower than existing
 - Dark Sky compliant
 - Shields shall be provided as option as field installed or at time of manufacture

Terms of Response

 - Project is expected to be 100% funded through energy efficiency incentives for cost-effective measures installed per the Compact's Energy Efficiency Plan.
 - However, other financing or outside funding, if available, may be included in the Response.

Terms of Response Guaranteed Savings

The selected Contractor shall provide the Compact with a written guarantee of energy savings and related obligations per M.G.L. c. 25A, §11I

 - The Cape Light Compact and Contractor will provide any supporting materials and data upon request to Towns or Fire Districts who have additional approvals of other agencies/authorities, however, these are Town or FD applications that the Project assumes the Town or FD will obtain prior to start of installations.
