STRATEGY DISCUSSION ON CONTESTED LEGAL ISSUES ON 2016 -2018 ENERGY EFFICIENCY PLAN, DPU 15-166

M. Downey reviewed the matter of serving natural gas customers who call the Compact's call center and request to be served by the Cape Light Compact. M. Song reviewed the summary of the history of Cape Light Compact providing energy efficiency services to customers who heat their homes with gas. She noted that these customers pay into both the electric and gas energy efficiency programs.

M. Downey reviewed recent negotiations with National Grid. National Grid filed a Pre-Hearing Statement with the Department of Public Utilities (DPU) on 11/6/15 regarding Cape Light Compact's service to natural gas customers through the Compact's the Home Energy Services Program.

National Grid and Cape Light Compact met on 11/13/15 and arrived at a tentative agreement to use a common vendor who can invoice each for services, calculate savings and collect relevant information. There will also be joint marketing. Cape Light Compact and National Grid will continue to refine the agreement.

There was discussion regarding the Compact's authorization from the DPU to serve all customers in a fuel neutral manner. Staff noted that National Grid would claim the gas savings and the Compact would claim the electric savings. R. Schofield noted that other Program Administrators, not the Compact, are eligible for performance incentives for meeting savings goals, the performance incentive pool is \$100,000,000. The sense of the Board was in favor to resolve the matter and continuing to work with National Grid.
